Workshop: **Images in Fiber**, with: **Fafnir Adamites**

### Class Description:

Learn methods to transfer original or found images onto cloth. Then, develop your fiber-based images by working into them with various stitching techniques. Drawing with thread is an exciting way to add color, shading, depth and dimension to 2-D work. This class is ideal for fiber artists, illustrators, photographers, and anyone else looking to expand their image-making practice with new techniques and materials.

### Supply Information:

Your supply fee includes 2 yards of bleached muslin, black and white embroidery floss and 6 chartpak AD blender markers, plus basic studio consumables.

In addition, your instructor requests that you bring the following materials:

- 5-8 black and white images no larger than 5 x 7," high contrast images work best for this process
- If possible, black and white photocopies of each image made from a toner-based photocopier (not laser printer or inkjet)
- A few color images from magazines or newspaper
- Source images can be photographs, illustrations, etc.
- A sketchbook or notebook and favorite drawing or writing utensils (optional)
- An apron, smock and/or clothes you don't mind getting messy (Snow Farm aprons are available for sale) (optional)

### Open Studio Guidelines for the Farmhouse Studio/Fibers:

Open studio is available 4:30-9pm on Saturday. Instructors will outline safety guidelines for students who are staying to work, including any tools that should not be used without the instructor present. We suggest *bringing a cell phone in case an emergency arises and you need to contact the on-site coordinator*. Please also note the following guidelines:

- There is to be no consumption of drugs or alcohol in the studios, nor shall students work with studio equipment when under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- The last person in any studio is responsible for turning off indoor lights and closing the doors.
