## **Workshop Information and Student Supply List**

**Workshop: Mosaic Stepping Stones with Christine Kenneally**

**Date: May 11-12, 2019**

**Studio Location: Kiln/Stained Glass/Mosaics Studio**

### Workshop Description:

Work with concrete and stained glass to create mosaic stepping stones for your garden or walkway. In two days, you will design and make two stepping stones, and you'll take home the mold so you can continue creating at home. Learn how to cut glass and use the Indirect method for creating mosaics that will be a conversation piece in any garden!

### Supply Information:

Your supply fee includes a stepping stone mold, tile tape, cement and enough glass to complete a 12 inch mosaic, plus basic studio consumables such as latex gloves, contact paper and vaseline. In addition, your instructor requests that you bring the following materials:

- Any favorite tools that you would like to work with (optional)
- Any bits of broken pottery that you wish to incorporate (pieces must be flat) (optional)
- A sketchbook or notebook and favorite drawing or writing utensils (optional)
- An apron, smock and/or clothes you don't mind getting messy (Snow Farm aprons are available for sale)

### Additional Supply Guidelines:

Additional glass is available for purchase from the studio. Please bring a check for glass purchased during class.

### Important Safety Guidelines for the Kiln/Stained Glass/Mosaics Studio:

Proper attire:

- No open-toe shoes

Please also bring the following safety gear:

- Pair of clear safety glasses (Snow Farm has basic safety glasses but you may be more comfortable if you bring your own)
- Hair tie to tie back long hair

### Open Studio Guidelines for the Kiln/Stained Glass/Mosaics Studio:

Open studio is available 24 hours per day throughout your workshop. Instructors will outline safety guidelines for students who are staying to work, including any tools that should not be used without the instructor present. We suggest *bringing a cell phone in case an emergency arises and you need to contact the on-site coordinator*. Please also note the following guidelines:

- There is to be no consumption of drugs or alcohol in the studios, nor shall students work with studio equipment when under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- There is to be no torch work without the instructor or another student present.
- The last person in any studio is responsible for turning off indoor lights and closing the doors.

She has been working in mosaics since 2004 and believes that it would take many lifetimes to learn all there is to know about this versatile art form. Her personal work is inspired by nature and the relationships between form, pattern, and the emotion that can be conveyed through andamento. Her teaching incorporates the traditional methods and concepts employed throughout history, with an understanding that in each mosaic, there is an art to deciding whether to follow these rules or creatively abandon them. She has exhibited her work locally and regionally, and has done small and large-scale installations in public spaces, colleges, small businesses, non-profit organizations, and private homes. She has been teaching and lecturing about the art of mosaics since 2007.
